
HOW TO REGISTER FOR PROGRAMS:

Content is grouped into subject areas (cooking, book discussions, crafts, entertainment, sustainability, etc.) and then by age ranges, based on the developmental and social abilities of each unique age range. Adult classes are for patrons age 18 and up. You can register:

- In person
- On the phone
- Online using our program registration calendar
- On chat reference

Register online by going to www.lindenhurstlibrary.org and click on "news and events" and "program calendar."

Click on the title of the program you want to register for. Classes with kits are limited to Lindenhurst Memorial Library card holders, and require a library barcode to complete registration. If a class is full, and you join a waitlist, you will be notified if a spot opens or if a kit becomes available. Unless otherwise noted, all programs are virtual, and take place using Zoom. Once your registration is completed, you will receive a confirmation email with a link for the program, if applicable. For events taking place on Facebook, you don't need a personal Facebook account! LIBRARY BUDGET VOTE AND TRUSTEE ELECTION:

Tuesday, April 6, 2021: 10am - 8pm

Residents of the Lindenhurst Union Free School District who are registered with the Suffolk County Board of Elections can vote in person at the Library. Voter registration forms can be obtained through the Board of Elections, the post office, or at the Library. For voter eligibility requirements, please contact the Suffolk County Board of Elections. Absentee ballot applications are available at the library. Applications must be received by the Library Director at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Upon approval of the application, an absentee ballot will be issued. All absentee ballots must be received at the Library by 5:00 p.m. on April 6 to be counted. Persons designated by the Suffolk County Board of Elections as "permanently disabled" following provisions of the election law automatically receive an absentee ballot and need not apply.

There will be a virtual Budget and Trustee Information Meeting on March 23 at 6:00 pm. For the second year in a row, the proposed operating budget stays flat with a 0% increase. The Board of Trustees are mindful that 2020, and now 2021, continue to be challenging for many residents due to Covid-19. We are committed to supplying access both physically and virtually, to materials, services and programs.

Annual debt service payments were previously approved under a separate vote held on October 16, 2019. Payments were scheduled to begin in 2020, but the Board chose to use the pledged \$500,000 in capital funds to delay debt service during the height of the pandemic. We are excited for the start of physical construction, and look forward to being part of the positive growth of new residents and businesses coming to Lindenhurst.

BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE:

As of the newsletter printing, we are waiting for approval of mechanical and engineering drawings. Once building permits are received from the state, the public bidding process will begin. Construction is still on schedule to begin in June 2021, and it is estimated that work will take 12-18 months to fully complete.
