"As a result of the mutually co-operative efforts of the faculty, administration, and the Board of Education, many changes have taken place in our school. The most evident change, of course, is the construction of the new Junior High School, resulting in full-time sessions for all students. Because of this, a number of changes are now evident in the High School. The transformation of the shop areas into a kitchen has enabled us to have a cafeteria program for the first time. We have added to the number of available classrooms, made improvements in the gymnasium and auditorium, and extended the Senior High School Library. Another significant change is the new Industrial Arts Annex, which will provide facilities for our students enabling them to develop a superior background in industrial arts and in technical subjects.
Besides these physical changes, developments in the area of curriculum have also been made. Advanced courses are now being offered in Language, Science, Art, Social Studies and English. Also, more enrichment programs in the summer school program represent worthwhile trends. These changes are a tribute to all who have participated in their development."
