The news articles acquaint students of what is going on in the school. The special features and editorials are often educational and meant to entertain, apprising readers what people do and what they think, expressing the opinions of its editors, and informing how certain political or club events effect the average student.

The Broadcast is composed of three main departments: editorial, printing, and circulation. The editorial department handles all stories, including pictures, and all printed material. 

Art Service Club




HENRY MICHEL HISTORY SEMINAR
