1. What is your favorite television program? As could be expected the class splintered among the numerous shows available, with the following programs excelling: The Fugitive - 19 (46), The Outer Limits - 11 (28), Dr. Kildare - 8 (20), Bonanza, Mr. Novak - 7 (18 each), Dick Van Dyke, McHale's Navy - 5.4 (14), Combat, Hootenanny - 3.5 (9), Burke's Law - 2.7 (7), Beverly Hillbillies, Arrest and Trial, Eleventh Hour, TW3 - 2.2. (6), Others - 21 (55), and finally 8 (21) don't watch television. Total - 253 votes.
2. Your favorite radio station? WINS - 37.5 (118), WMCA - 26 (81), WABC - 19 (60), WGLI - 10.5 (33), WHN - 3 (10), WBAB - 2 , WBZ - 1 , WMGM - 1, don't like radios - 3, and 3 listen to Radio Free Europe. Total 312 votes.
3. Do you think yourself a conformist? This is amusing because only $27.4 \%$ (84) think themselves conformists while $72.6 \%$ (222) do not. Could it be that the 64 class conforms in its non-conformity? Total - 306 votes.
4. Do you like classical, folk, rock and roll or jazz? Rock and roll - 69.1 (215) folk - 19.6 (61), classical - $6.4(20)$, jazz - 4.7 (15).
5. Which singer or instrumental group do you like best? The Beatles - 48 (112), Johnny Mathis - 8 (22), Peter, Paul and Mary - 7 (18), Four Seasons - (14), Tymes - (11), Connie Frances (8), Elvis Presley - (8) You remember him, don't you? Beach Boys - (5), and (70) others totaling $26 \%$. Total - 269 votes.
6. Do you think your education worthwhile in directing you to your future profession? Yes - 87.7 (271), no - 12.3 (38). Shows success on the educational means used, at least now before the class tries to go into the profession of their choice. Total - 309 votes.
7. Did there seem to be strict, moderate or lax school rules? Strict - 27.2 (83), moderate - 66.8 (203), lax $-6(18)$, total - 304 votes.

Total - 302 votes.
12. If the U.S. should find itself in such a position that all other alternatives were closed save a world war with the Soviet Union OR surrender to the Soviet Union, which would you favor? War - 96 (285), surrender - 1.8 (5), situation could never arise - (4), no comment - (2), sucicide - one. Total 302 votes.
13. Who would you like to see be President for the coming four years? Lyndon B. Johnson - 53.8 (150), Robert F. Kennedy - 15.9 (44), Barry M. Goldwater 12.2 (34), Richard M. Nixon - 9 (25), Margaret Chase Smith - (4), Ringo Starr - (3), others - (5). Coincides with the national mood quite similarly and shows that a ticket of Johnson-Kennedy against one of Goldwater-Nixon would have been landslided into office on the date of the poll. Total - 278 votes.
14. Are you working, looking for a job or don't want or need a job? Working 30.1 (90), looking for a job - 60 (168), don't want or need a job - 9.9 (39). Total 297 votes.
15. Do you expect to make it into the 21 st century? Yes - 88.6 (27), no -8.8 (27), maybe - $2.6(8)$. Fittingly one answer to this question turned out, "No, not the way I drive." This is worth remembering if you intend to even get into next year, let alone 2000 . Total - 311 votes.
